Members and associates of the GSSA are active in a range of applied fields such as livestock production, wildlife management, nature conservation, water catchment management, rangeland rehabilitation and socio-economic aspects of rangeland management under different land tenure regimes.

The Society enjoys strong support from universities as well as government departments (primarily agriculture but also various conservation agencies). The GSSA has a multi-disciplinary base and promotes interaction between environmental practitioners, scientists and students who are affiliated with a wide range of institutions including government, universities, development, agricultural, wildlife and related agencies.
