


1) NCT Forestry Co-operative Ltd.

- Forestry Co-operative, owned and run by timber farmers
- Over 2000 Members
- Approximately 300,000 hectares of timber plantations:
 - 73,000 ha pine
 - 108,000 ha wattle
 - 145,000 ha eucalypts






2) Fire and fire protection

- Any management recommendations must take fire protection objectives into consideration


Linking independent timber growers to markets





















b) Management of open areas –annual burning

Summary
