It is with great excitement that we announce the 18th Kimberley Biodiversity Research Symposium (KBRS) on <u>27 September 2023 at Sol Plaatje University in Kimberley</u>. It is hosted jointly by the Northern Cape Department of Agriculture, Environmental Affairs, Rural Development and Land Reform (DAERL), the South African National Parks (SANParks), the McGregor Museum, the Arid Node of the South African Environmental Observation Network (SAEON), the Sol Plaatje University (SPU), and the Biological Invasions Directorate of the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI). For 2023 no registration fee will be payable.

Any field of biodiversity related research will be consider including interdisciplinary research topics such as biodiversity interfaces with social sciences, rangeland management, development and impacts, legislation and policy, water resource management and land rehabilitation. Contributions directly applicable to the Northern Cape Province will be prioritised. A 15 minute time limit will apply to presentations which includes 2 minutes for Q&A. Posters contributions are welcomed. No PowerPoint presentations are required for posters.

Attendees of the full day event get 1 Continuous Professional Development (CPD) point under Category 1 as required by the South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions (SACNASP).
